# The Benefits of PTA Over Unaffiliated Parent Groups

## PTAs and unaffiliated parent groups (like PTOs) run properly/legally are similar:

- o Incorporated non-profits with elected officers
- o Bylaws and Procedures, Roberts' Rules of Order
- o General Membership meetings and minutes; board meetings and minutes
- Insurance to protect organization and leaders
- Legal/financial requirements (IRS 990, MD Personal Property Report, MD Charitable Solicitations Act filing, banking in organization's name, treasurer's reports, annual financial reviews (audits))

#### Benefits of PTA:

- Local PTA units are part of something bigger (not just about fundraising and party planning!)
- o National PTA: oldest and largest child advocacy organization in country; legislative powerhouse on Capitol Hill
- o Free State PTA (FSPTA): state-level public school and child advocacy
- o PTA is official parent group-partner of Baltimore County Public Schools
- Much-needed support, training, resources, and oversight from PTA Council, FSPTA, and National PTA (NPTA)
- National PTA membership benefits/discounts; benefits from GiveBacks (free PTA management tool)
- Reasonable insurance (\$226/year through FSPTA and AIM Insurance)

### • PTA Council of Baltimore County:

- o Speaks at Board of Education (BOE) meetings as stakeholder, speaks for 1,000s of members at County meetings and in Annapolis
- o Regular contact with BCPS leadership; BCPS official sits on Council board
- o Invited to school system task forces and work groups
- Seat on School Board Nominating Commission to appoint BOE members

## Only "Cons" of PTA:

- Portion of membership dues collected by PTA units goes to FSPTA and NPTA, but support, resources, oversight, and reasonable insurance make up for this
- PTA Council collects dues since it has no source of income to pay for support it provides to units; 2024-25 Council dues will be \$50 in total per unit
