President's Letter

WELCOME to the 2022-23 school year! We're excited about the upcoming year for many reasons.

First, we hope we're finally moving past the pandemic and that schools and PTA units will be operating in a more normal way this year. Many units were negatively affected over the past couple of years. Please know that PTA Council will continue to be a link to training, resources, services, and advocacy.

District Transportation - PTA Council is closely linked to the BCPS Office of Family and Community Engagement through board member Sue Hahn, who facilitated a virtual meeting on July 14th between Deputy Superintendent Dr. Yarbrough, Chief of Staff Ms. Charley-Greene, PTA presidents, and PTA Council to discuss transportation issues. Thanks to all presidents or delegates who attended. The session was extremely well-received, and participants indicated an interest in having monthly meetings to cover different subjects. This is a big step forward in increased communications and engagement between the school system and PTAs.

Equity - Thanks to Sue Hahn's encouragement, we applied for a National PTA grant with an equity focus. Even if we don't win, we'll still carry out facets of the proposed plan.

Events - We've been busy attending some big events. On 7/27 Family-School and Community Partnerships Committee Chair Ramona Basilio and I attended the BCPS Partnership Fair and on 8/2 we attended the BCPS Community Schools Symposium. Southeast Area VP Will Feuer, who serves on the BCPS Community Schools Steering Committee, was also there. Both were amazing events and we turned out to be quite popular at both. PTAs are a big part of Family Engagement, so many principals and Community School Facilitators reached out during and after the events to talk about starting, restarting, or growing PTAs at their schools. PTA Council has advocated for years for the community school model, which offers a strategic, partnership-based, holistic approach to serving students and their families by having some schools become community hubs.

Free State PTA Convention - The 7/28-31 Free State PTA Convention had great participation from Baltimore County PTA leaders and Council board members. Since past Council President Jayne Lee (current VP for Leadership) serves as FSTPA's Secretary and on several committees, she was an integral part of making the event a success. I learned so much; FSPTA and Council will share resources.

Workshops & General Meeting - Our annual Fall Workshops and General Meeting will be held on *Thursday,* September 29th at 7pm at Loch Raven High School. Watch for an invitation and program information soon.

Our website, www.bcptacouncil.org, has many of the powerpoints from our past trainings, but attending this event will give you the ability to network, ask questions, and give feedback on what you want YOUR Council to help you with.

OCTOBER

- ► Send copy of your unit's annual financial review to Free State PTA (due 10/30)
- ► Pay Free State PTA and National PTA membership dues monthly; first payment due October 1

Standards Of Continuing Affiliation

In addition to paying member dues and providing officer contact information to Free State PTA (FSPTA), you must complete the following:

- ✓ **BYLAWS**: Bylaws need to be reviewed at least every 3 years and submitted to FSPTA for approval. All units should have submitted bylaws to FSPTA by 6/1/22. If you still need to do this, use the template here: https://www.fspta.org/bylaws
- ✓ **FINANCIAL REVIEW (AUDIT)**: All PTAs must conduct an annual financial review (due 10/30) and email a copy to FSPTA at jlee@fspta.org. Refer to "Cash Encounters" in the Finances section of our website for a sample report.
- ✓ **INSURANCE**: Every PTA unit in Maryland must have insurance coverage through AIM. Enrollment forms were emailed to all PTAs. Coverage ended 6/30/22. See the PTA Council website's Finances/Insurance section for details.
- ✓ **IRS 990**: Every PTA must file annually by 11/15. If annual gross income was \$50,000 or less, you can submit the 990 e-postcard. Provide a copy of the 990 filing to FSPTA at jlee@fspta.org. More details here: https://www.irs.gov/charities-and-nonprofits
- ✓ MARYLAND CHARITABLE SOLICITATIONS ACT UPDATE: As a charitable organization soliciting in Maryland, your unit must file documents with the Office of the Secretary of State. Registration is required prior to the commencement of solicitations (for new units) and an annual update is required. https://sos.maryland.gov/Charity/Pages/Registering-Charity.aspx
- INCORPORATION/MARYLAND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX
 RETURN: All local PTAs must be incorporated in Maryland. To maintain your incorporation status, a Personal Property Tax Return must be filed by April 15 each year if your PTA owns any property or not. Send a copy to FSPTA at jlee@fspta.org. Check your status at: www.dat.state.md.us. If your unit is not incorporated or the incorporation needs to be revived, contact FSPTA.

For all shared documents, be sure to keep copies for yourself!

PTA Insurance

Unit presidents should have received invoices from AIM via email.

Free State PTA offers low-cost insurance (\$226/year) to local units. Your package has not changed. Your payment to AIM was due on July 1. If you need help, contact 1-800-876-4044 or Pamela Brizendine at pbrizendine@aim-companies.com

Council Dues

Dues are only \$5 per unit again this year, as voted upon by the PTA Council Board of Directors, which recognized the continuing issues created by COVID-19.

We can't completely waive dues because of a stipulation in our bylaws (dues were 50¢/member based on last year's membership numbers).

Council dues are separate from Free State PTA and National PTA dues. Invoices for Council dues are in the Back-to-School Package sent to units via BCPS interoffice mail.

PTA: Who's Who?

<u>School</u>: Local PTA units are independent non-profits with state and federal requirements.

<u>County</u>: PTA Council is an all-volunteer support and training organization with no legal standing over units. Units pay Council Dues to be supported and represented by the Council, which does no fundraising. We represent local units as a stakeholder group at Board of Education meetings, on the School Board Nominating Commission, and on BCPS and County focus and work groups.

<u>State</u>: Units are chartered under Free State PTA (www.fspta.org)

<u>National</u>: Free State PTA is chartered under National PTA (www.pta.org)

PTA members are members of their local units, Free State PTA, and National PTA because they pay dues to all. Members enjoy many benefits:

We strongly recommend that your unit use MemberHub, which allows you to sell memberships online (MemberHub has found that this increases membership by about 34%!), communicate with members, create a directory, sell merchandise, create a newletter, AND have members print their own membership cards.

If you want to get started with MemberHub, contact Free State PTA Membership at membership@fspta.org.

Member dues for each unit are decided upon at a board meeting. Different levels can be set (for example, \$10/member; \$6/staff member (to encourage the homeschool partnership); and \$25/business membership). Just remember when setting your dues that:

- National PTA dues are \$2.25/member
- Free State PTA dues are \$2.00/member

Each unit remits dues monthly in the amount of \$4.25/member to National PTA until Free State PTA can do so. Use the form found here to pay dues:

BOARD BASICS: Things To Keep In Mind

Your unit is a recognized corporation in Maryland and a recognized 501(c)3 charitable organization (non-profit) in the eyes of the IRS; abide by non-profit, IRS, and Maryland requirements.

You run a business, the main goal of which is advocating for children and youth; you fundraise to achieve goals you set.

3:1 rule: 3 non-fundraising activities (educational or enrichment programs) for every 1 fundraiser; try to serve as many students as you can with your programs and be inclusive as you can

As a non-profit, remain non-partisan or you risk losing your tax-exempt status (don't endorse political candidates!).

Be a good steward of your unit's funds; expenditures should not be for personal gain, but for the good of the organization.

When you advocate, don't counter National PTA, Free State PTA, or PTA Council positions. If you're not sure, ask.

BE VISIBLE to your community; make sure your PTA is on your school's website with current contact and membership information.

Transition Checklist (adapted from Free State PTA Convention training materials)

- Financial Review
 - ✓ Review Committee should have been created at last Board of Directors meeting of year; 3 people (usually PTA members) who did not have check-signing authority during fiscal year under review should take part
 - ✓ Fiscal year-end was 6/30/22; meet after 7/1/22 once June bank statement has been received and reconciled
 - ✓ Copy sent to Free State PTA (jlee@fspta.org) by 10/30/22

- ✓ Present review to your general membership
- Liability, Directors & Officers Insurance Through AIM:
 - ✓ Coverage period July 1 to June 30
- Procedure Books
- ✓ Every Officer and Chair should maintain written records of duties, practices, and efforts for reference and to pass to their successor
- Accounts, Passwords, Combinations, Keys & Codes
 - ✓ Email Accounts, social media/online tools
- Finances
 - ✓ Bank Accounts
 - ✓ Turn over checkbook and all Treasurer materials
 - ✓ Go to bank together and change signers (may need election meeting minutes to prove identities of officers)
 - ✓ Cash box and night deposit bag and keys
 - ✓ IRS e-file information
